Fatma Qandil wins 2022 Mahfouz Medal








Fish, Milk, Tamarind wins Gourmand Awards

world.




Talking Cinematic Cairo

Here is the recording of last month's in-person book launch of *Cinematic Cairo: Egyptian Urban Modernity from Reel to Real*, with the volume editors Nezar AlSayyad and Heba Safey Eldeen and discussants Basil Kamel and Mogib El-Rahman.

Cairo has provided rich subject material for Egypt's film industry since the inception of the art form at the end of the nineteenth century. The "reel" city—imagined, perceived, and experienced—provides the spatial domain that mirrors change and allows for an interrogation of the "real" city as it encountered modernity over the course of a century.


The event was held in collaboration with the AUC Tahrir Cultural Center and the 44th Cairo International Film Festival.







