




Taher wrote short stories and was the author of several well-known novels, including *Love in Exile*, about Lebanon's 1982 Sabra and Shatila massacre, translated and published by the AUC Press. ## The world of Fayoum pottery



# The 41st Sharjah International Book Fair

Once again, AUC Press attended the Publishers Conference segment of the annual Sharjah International Book Fair (SIBF), held at the Expo Centre Sharjah from 30 October to 1 November 2022. During the conference, hundreds of publishers from around the world met to buy and sell language rights in a wide range of publications, from novels and children's books to nonfiction general interest titles. The AUC Press also attended the sixth edition of the Arab Publishers Conference, which was held this year in strategic partnership with the SIBF, from 2 to 3 November. Titled "Arabic Content-Creation and Post-Pandemic Challenges", the conference brought together professionals in the Arabic-language publishing industry to speak on a range of topics, including the repercussions of Covid-19 on the industry, digitization, supply chain problems, and the influence of authors and publishers on the Arabic language.
